

A Tribute

Bernice Carson Crisp was the second girl of four sisters and one brother born to Charles and Julia Holley. She grew up in Greensboro, North Carolina, where she attended Immanuel Lutheran College, a private Lutheran high school.

Later she attended Howard University, where she received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Social Studies. She returned to North Carolina where she taught high school until 1936. She met and married James Wilbur Crisp on June 02, 1936 and had one son Charles Wilbur Crisp.

The family moved to Maryland in the late 1940's where she taught at Lincoln Elementary School and at Fairmont Heights High School. She earned her Master's Degree from Columbia University in New York during the early 1950's. She taught in the Maryland school system, but mainly at her "favorite", Fairmont Heights High School for more than 38 years. She often was assigned the toughest students, but they loved her; and, of course, she loved them. Many of her students stayed in touch with her through out her life.

Mrs. Crisp enjoyed fishing, boating, bowling, and arts and crafts. She lived in North Englewood until the passing of her husband of 36 years. She then moved in with her son, Wilbur and his wife, Patricia, with whom she spent the last 15 years of her life.

An avid reader, she also loved to travel and spent time with her grandchildren. Most of all, she loved her church, Peace Lutheran, where she was the Mother of the church. She loved to read and discuss the Bible.

The real proof of her affectuous love and teaching was evident when one of her former students at age 76, at the home going services for her "favorite" teacher at age 99, related that Mrs. Crisp taught her in the 5th grade at Lincoln Elementary School. What a testimony and tribute!

Mrs. Crisp will surely be missed, but will always be in the hearts of faculty, staff, alumni and the community that she touched with her angelic smile and perpetual love.
