






Thelma Spriggs Battle Obituary

Benny, as he was affectionately known by his family and friends, met the love of his life Cecile ("Cile") at the age of 13. After a long courtship, they were married in 1966. One son was born from this union - Benjamin John Bowlding III.

After graduating from high school, Benny held positions at the Glendale Hospital and at Craftsman Press. He began working for the Giant warehouse in 1974. He worked for many years in various roles for Giant. He retired in 2002 after 28 years of dedicated service. After retirement, Benny began many self-employment opportunities that filled his idle time.

Benny became a member of Galilee Baptist Church in 1993 and was active in church activities, particularly the Men's Fellowship.

Known as the "Mayor of Seat Pleasant", Benny was very active in many community activities and events. He had the gift of gab. Benny never met a stranger. He always took the time to talk to everyone, regardless of their status. He never looked down on anyone and always worked to encourage others to be the best that they could be.

As a proud member of the E. Jerry Williams Mason Lodge #141 since 1997, Benny participated in all Lodge activities and loved being with his Lodge brothers. He also had a variety of interesting hobbies, including: fishing, hunting, shopping, roller skating and cooking, especially for neighborhood events and block parties. Benny was an avid Redskins fan. He never missed watching a game, no matter what was happening at the time.

Benny was an antique car collector and enthusiast who frequented Antique Car Shows at the Boulevard and other locations around the Beltway. He often showcased his own vehicles and provided input to others that were interested in the hobby.

Benny was a dedicated family man. He is survived by his wife Cecile, his son, Benjamin John Bowlding III and the other love of his life, his grand-daughter Brianna Bruce. He leaves to mourn three sisters : Delores Robinson, Betty Eldridge and Sharon Bowlding; and six brothers: Donald Bowlding, Harold Thomas-Bowlding, Ralph Bowlding, Theodore (Tony) Yorkshire, Sr., Jerome Yorkshire Sr., and Gregory (Greg) Spicer. 
He is also survived by his favorite uncle, Tyrone Taylor and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, in-laws, neighbors and friends.

Obituary

"A Chapter completed, a Page turned, a Life well-spent, a Rest well earned".

Roger Preston Beam, age 70, returned to his Creator on Tuesday, July 24, 2012, following a brief illness as he was surrounded by members of his family. He was the fourth of seven children born to McKinley Beam and Lucy Mae Grooms on February 10, 1942, in Washington, D.C. He was preceded in death by his parents; brother, Ellsworth; sisters, Ogdenia and Laverne; and grandson, Delavan Lamont Beam.

He accepted Christ at an early age and was baptized at First Baptist Church of Deanwood. While at First Baptist Church of Deanwood, he enjoyed singing in the choir. He attended Prince George's County Public Schools and graduated from Fairmont Heights High School in 1960. After high school, he supported his family by working with Teamsters Local 639 for more than 32 years, beginning as a truck driver with Editors Press and ending as a Business Agent.

Roger will be remembered for reaching out to others, sacrificing for friends and family and his love for fishing and bowling. His devotion and time to his wife, children, grandchildren, great grandchildren, siblings, and the entire family will be truly missed; but the legacy of love he has left them will NEVER be forgotten. One of his favorite quotes says "One thing becomes clearer as one gets older and one's fishing experience increases, and that is the importance of one's fishing companions." Roger was forever grateful to have the most dedicated friends and fishing buddies, who included the deceased Dave Brody, John Sumter, James (T.J.) Gamble and Thomas (Tommy) Barnes, and his surviving friends Walter Taylor, Apache Martin and LaVern Mullin.

His accomplishments were many, to include volunteering for the 2002 PG County Christmas-in-April Program; 2007 Girls & Boys Town Christmas Appeal; and continuous contributions to the Local 639 Annual Golf Tournament for The Benefit of Children's Hospital in Washington DC. One of his most notable achievements was related to his favorite hobby of fishing, when the state of Maryland recognized him for catching a 76 pound Black Drum Fish in 2003.

He leaves to cherish his memories to his beloved wife, Betty Ann Beam; three sons, Ellsworth (Patricia), Larry (Tonya) and Roger (Joyce); three daughters, Cynthia, Letitia (Kevin) and Robin; 12 grandchildren, Stephanitra, Brian, Alicia, Mark, Ericka, Shadonna, Brandi, Brittany, Kevin Jr., Kirk, Zachary, and Zion; and 7 great grandchildren, Zion, Stephon, Delvon, Ryan, Aaliyah, Mekhi and James Jr.

Alma Mater


