Alvin began ministering the same year, conducting bible training and teaching the youth at Goodwill. He and his family left Goodwill in 1982 for Harvest Time Church in Lynwood, Washington. Alvin and Eleanor attended Harvest Time Bible College in 1983, and they became Home Fellowship Leaders and for the next fifteen years they saw many souls come to Christ. Many of those who came to those meetings were healed and delivered. It was nothing to come home on a Wednesday night and not be able to find a place to park in the driveway. You see, there were so many people that came, everybody tried to come early. Alvin and Eleanor founded the Youth Group at Harvest Time Church and before long; the young people were in the street telling other young people about Jesus. Alvin was licensed and ordained at Harvest Time Church in 2000.

While visiting Maui, Hawaii, in 1999, Alvin, heard the Holy Spirit speak to him again to go to the Maryland-DC area and tell the people "I'm (Jesus) coming soon". Three years ago, Alvin started a men's group in his home and a year later, he started a home fellowship meeting in his home. Alvin was quite the teacher and everyone enjoyed his unique style of sharing the Word of God.

Alvin was appointed Chaplain to the Prince George's County Fire Department in 2001 by Chief Ronald D. Blackwell. He always tried to make a difference in as many lives as he could. He loved what he did and thanked God for the opportunity. He also belonged to the Walker Mill Community Outreach and the Council of Governments. Alvin made an impact on many lives. He never forgot his spiritual daughters, Ivy Jones, Tracy Balogun, Angela Coleman, Anita Ogelsby and Faye Harris.

Alvin was preceded in death by his brother Robert Graham. He leaves to cherish precious memories his wife of over 50 years, Eleanor, daughter Michelle Hightower (Ralph), son Alvin Graham Jr. (Teri; grandson, Ezekiel Graham (Lamaria), granddaughters, Da' Shianna and Alexis Hightower; four great-grandchildren, Will, Lamarion, Younique and Josiah Graham; brother, Charles Graham; sister, Ruth Johnson; three sisters-in-law, special nephews and nieces, a host of cousins, friends and neighbors.

With thee forever.


